Widening horizons: overview

In addition to teaching the language, a language teacher can help to widen horizons. Here are some ways in which a teacher can do this:

- Raise awareness of cultural differences
- Do student projects with real-world content
- Give home assignments related to current issues
- Invite guest speakers from other fields, backgrounds

Widening horizons: example 1
